Emergency Evacuation/Transportation Procedures for Kosciusko County

A tornado leaves devastation where a small community once stood, flood waters race down the main street of town or highly trained workers tirelessly try to contain a chemical spill from a derailed train car, emergency situations like these may require the evacuation of the public, whether it is a small group or thousands of people. Although the hope that an emergency evacuation will never happen in Kosciusko County, common sense dictates the necessity to create strategies, assign responsibilities and test preparations so if a need arises the response will be safe, efficient and effective.

Daily media reports of disasters happening across the country show the necessity for immediate response at any time, in any place. How can the county move quantities of people from possible life-threatening areas to designated shelters? Who will move the people? What if they have special needs? Are they children, elderly, handicapped? What assistance can the various county, city and town entities, civil defense, law enforcement, fire departments, school corporations and Red Cross, expect? And from whom can they expect it? This paper will hopefully answer these questions and provide Kosciusko County with a viable and reliable system for emergency evacuations.

Through researching the different entities above, various disaster plans have been made, few include detailed transportation evacuation plans, most do not. The majority of evacuation plans lack written procedures or are vague and possibly unreliable. With the cooperation and assistance of the different county, city and town entities the following procedures have been created and coordinated with key county personnel to provide emergency evacuation service.

EMERGENCY TRANSPORTATION

I. SITUATION

1. "Disaster" measn occurence or imminent threat of wide-spread or severe damage, injury or loss of life or property resulting from any natural or man-made cause, including but not limited to fire, flood, earthquake, wind, storm, wave action, oil spill, other water contamination requiring emergency action to avert danger or damage, air contamination, drought, explosion, riot or hostile military or para-military action.

II. MISSION


- 1. The "statement of responsibility" to be carried out by your agency "KABS" is as follows:
 - A. KABS will be responsible for:
 - 1. Planning for the care or dismissal of riders on their buses depending upon the situation.
 - 2. Assisting the Civil Defense Transportation Officer with coordination of transportation and furnishing transportation as needed.

III. ADMINISTRATION AND LOGISTICS

Procedures:

- 1. County emergency personnel at the scene will determine if an evacuation is necessary. If it is, they will call KABS.
- 2. KABS will provide sufficient transportation for the evacuation.
- 3. KABS will determine who will provide the transportation and coordinate the evacuation transportation as necessary.
- 4. County emergency personnel and KABS will organize efforts with the Red Cross for designated relief location.
