Greetings,

The term that best characterized the Warsaw Community Development Corporation during 1997 was "revitalization". The corporation began to redesign itself, refreshed its mission statement, set new goals that focus on property ownership and affordable housing, and adopted a new image through a new logo and stationary. The board added new members who represent residents of the Central Business District. WCDC enhanced its computer system and developed a very successful Web site. The administrator's talents were recognized at the state level, resulting in her membership on a state Economic Development Board and a Property Tax Reform Task Force.

With WCDC Board and Administrator assistance, the downtown merchants created the new "Downtown Days" and "Hometown Holidays" events. Financial commitments were secured to greatly expand the revolving loan program for building facade renovation. There was strong support for the City to revitalize streets and sidewalks in the Central Business District. The Administrator served on the committee that increased the downtown Christmas decorations for further holiday beautification.

The Warsaw Biblical Gardens were restored to their former beauty this year through the dedication and talent of our master gardener, a host of volunteers and the leadership of the WCDC Administrator. Fundraising and promotional events revitalized the community's interest in the Gardens. Our new Web site brought national and international recognition and interest.

Revitalization of our downtown impacts us all. To those businesses and individuals who assisted our efforts through financial contributions and the donation of time and resources, thank you. We are looking forward to 1998 and all that will be accomplished through your efforts.

ACCOMPLIGHMENTS



In 1997, WCDC:

- •Adopted a new mission statement: "The mission of the Warsaw Community Development Corporation is to encourage the further economic development of the Warsaw Central Business District through investments in people, buildings, business and land."
- \bullet Secured \$200,000 in commitments for the continuation of the Revolving Loan Program for commercial property rehabilitation. The Revolving Loan has made 29 loans totaling \$500,000.
- •Purchased a home on High Street with the help of a \$200,000 grant from the Indiana Housing Finance Authority as well as a grant from the Kosciusko County Foundation. This purchase marked the beginning of WCDC'S initiative to create affordable nousing in Warsaw's central business district.
- •Completed the building expansion and renovation project at the Biblical Gardens. The newly-expanded building allowed the Gardens to host a series of gardening classes. 1997 saw the financial and physical stabilization of the Gardens, as well.
- •Worked with the Downtown Merchants' Association to plan and promote Downtown Days.

- •Created designs for the re-use and rehabilitation of several houses along the Jefferson Street Corridor with the help of a Ball State architecture student and the Indiana Main Street program.
- •Helped plan and coordinate the 1997 City of Lakes Annual Balloonfest Parade--the largest Balloonfest Parade to date.
- •Created World Wide Web pages for the WCDC and the Warsaw Biblicai Gardens. The WCDC page is among KC Online's top 10% visited site. The Biblical Gardens also has a high "hit rate," with a large number of international visitors.
- •Assisted in the creation of the Bike Path Plan, a multi-township project that will serve the central downtown area as well as surrounding areas.
- •Adopted a new logo, giving WCDC's correspondence a fresh, new look. The new WCDC logo emphasizes our mission of revitalization.
- •Helped secure Christmas Decorations for Downtown Warsaw.



- •Helped with the planning of the highly successful, second-annual Hometown Holiday Weekend.
- •Hosted the American Boy Choir-Biblical Gardens fundraiser
- •Held the annual Halloween Spooktakular with over 200 children participating in the costume judging contest.
