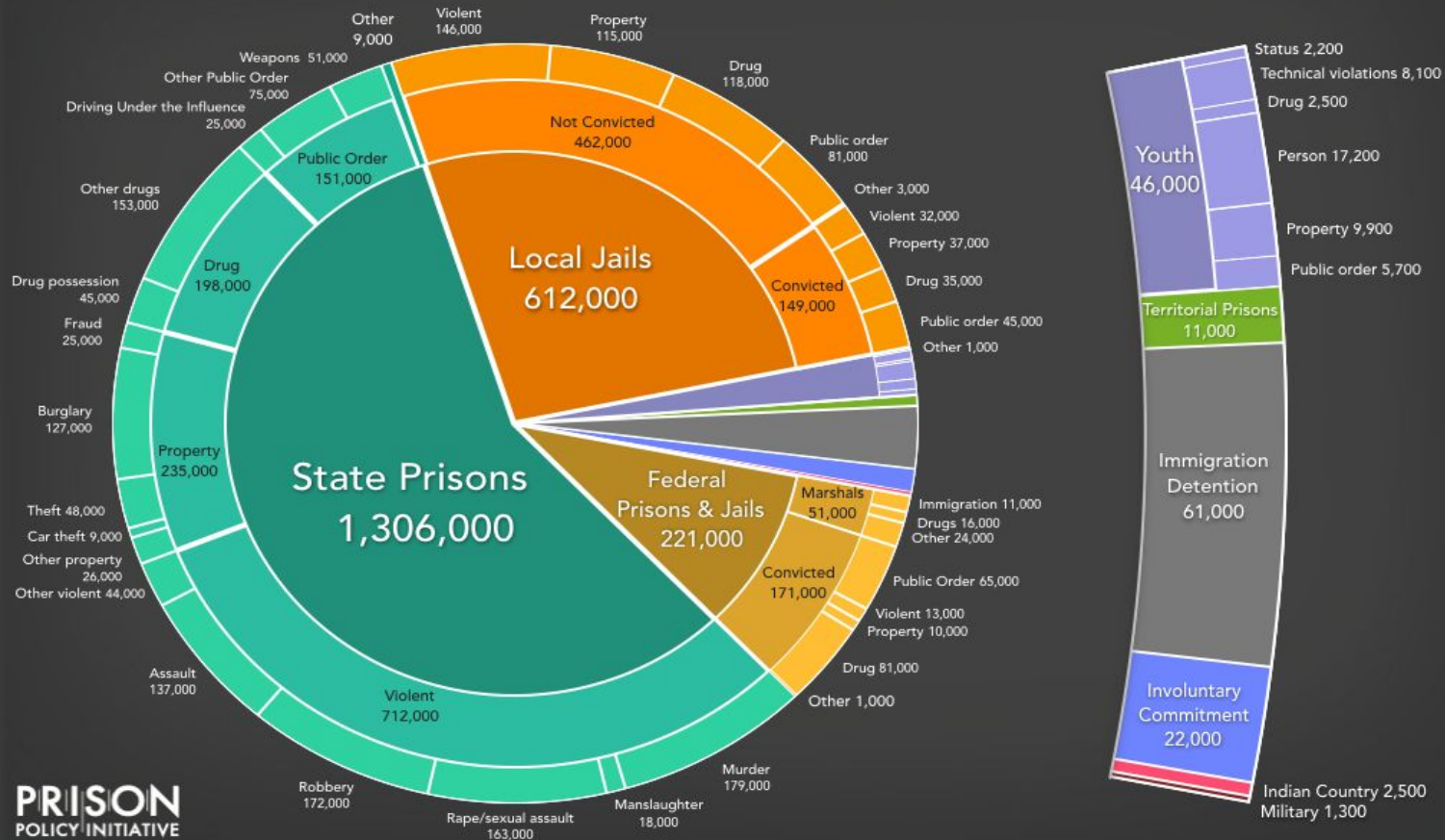

OTHER KEY FACTS

- The single most important predictor in recidivism is **joblessness**.
- GNP is reduced by **\$78 - \$87 billion** as a result of excluding formerly incarcerated individuals from the workforce.
- States that lower recidivism rates **by just 10%** could save an average of **\$635 million** annually.

How many people are locked up in the United States?

The U.S. locks up more people per capita than any other nation, at the staggering rate of 698 per 100,000 residents. But to end mass incarceration, we must first consider *where* and *why* 2.3 million people are confined nationwide.



1 in 5 incarcerated people is locked up for a drug offense

451,000 are incarcerated for nonviolent drug offenses on any given day.

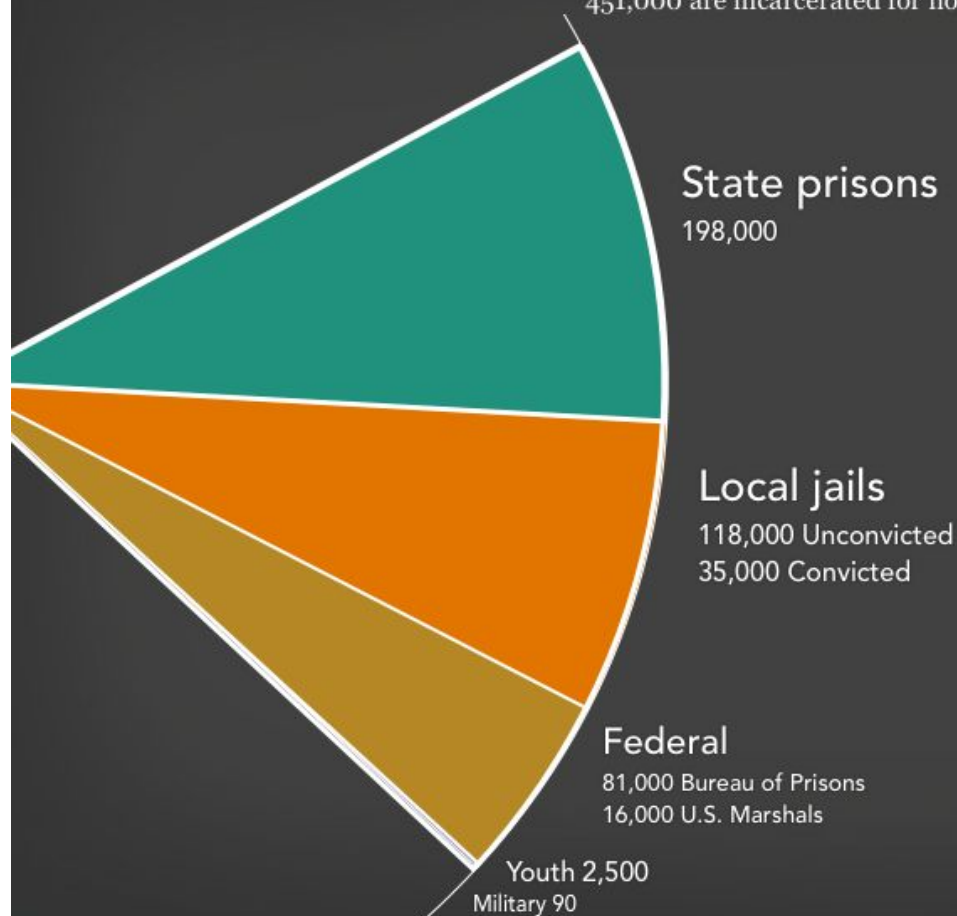
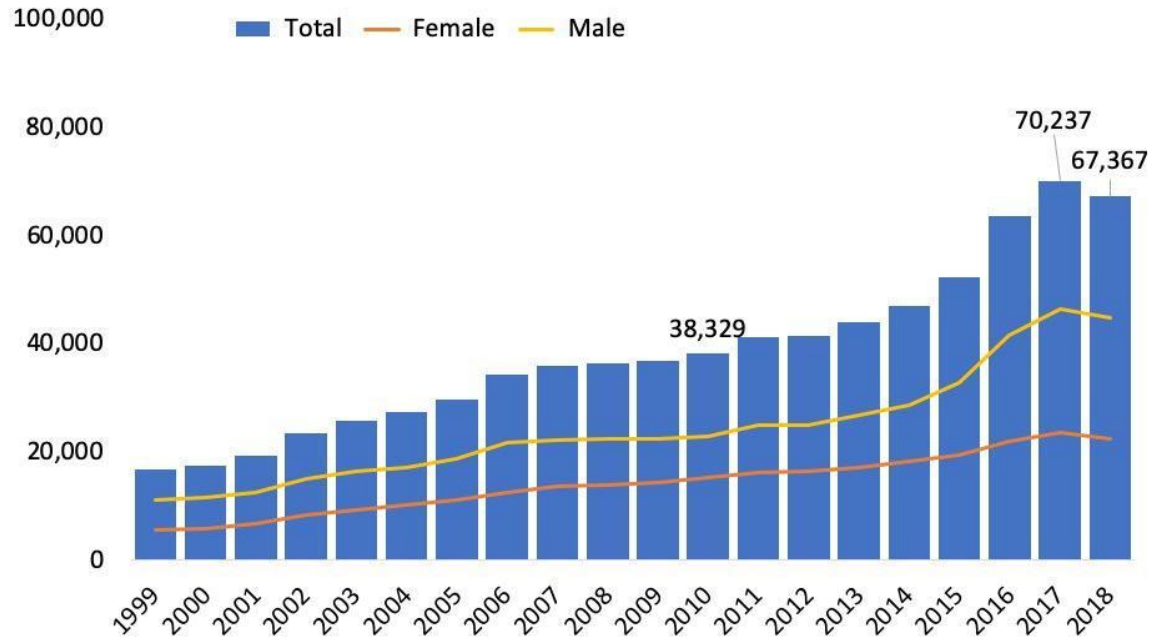


Figure 1. National Drug Overdose Deaths Number Among All Ages, by Gender, 1999-2018

OUR PROGRAM

- Participants are selected through an application process for the 90-120 day program
- Participants attend 6-8 hours of classes 5 days/week
- 50% Recovery based classes
- 50% Life-Skills classes
- Each participant completes 20 hours of service while in the program
- Community employers conduct mock-interviews to assist participants with building confidence and interview skills

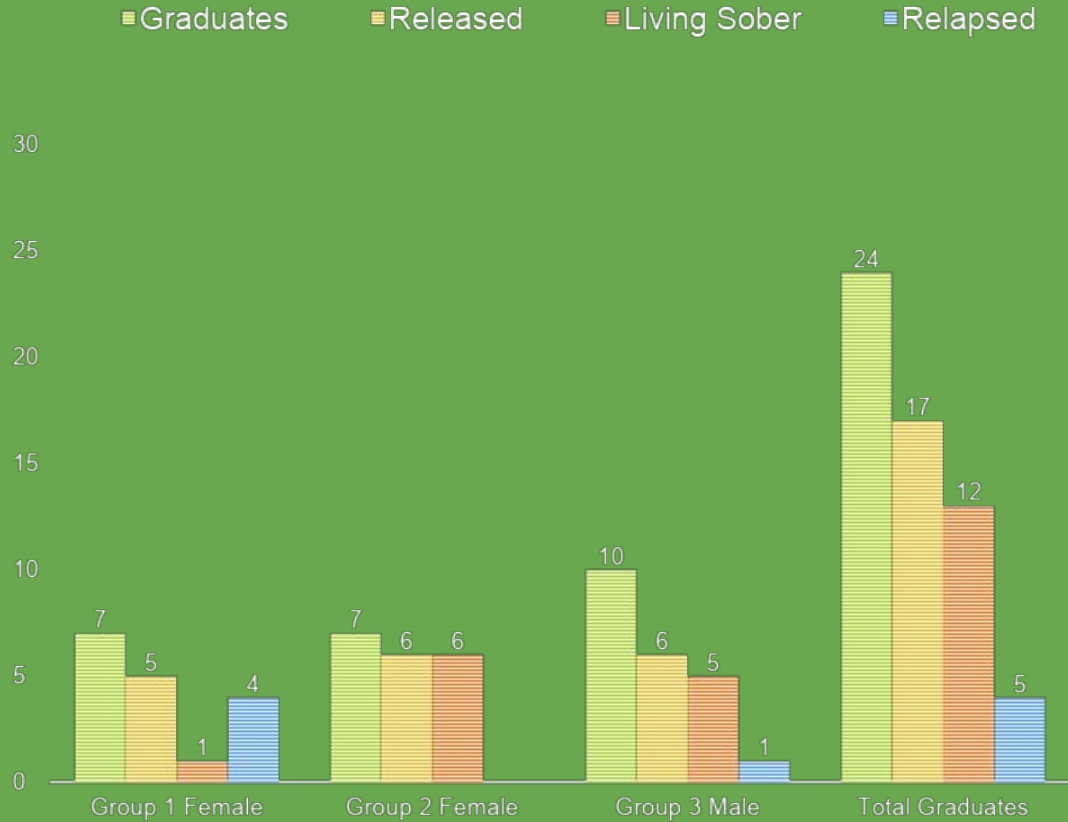
